Leaving Certificate Applied

LCA is an alternative two-year programme with a practical approach. Participants are mainly engaged in work and study of an active, learner-centred nature, which encourages strong community links and self-directed, task-based learning. In Scoil Ruáin, LCA students engage with a range of subjects and activities, which all count towards their tasks and key assignments.



Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

The LCVP is a Leaving Certificate with a focus on enterprise and preparation for working life. Experiences such as work placements, career investigations, mini-enterprises, business and community visits are an integral part of the programme.

Students receive the same certificate as other Leaving Certificate students, but their Leaving Certificate includes an additional statement of the results of the link modules (pass, merit or distinction). The programme gives students the same opportunity to proceed to universities and colleges as that enjoyed by the students who complete the Established Leaving Certificate.

Career Guidance

Career Guidance plays an essential role in students' lives in Scoil Ruáin. At senior level, Career Guidance is in place to ensure that all students receive the required support to make the transition from Scoil Ruáin to working life, further education or training. Navigation of the CAO, trips to centres of further education and individual meetings are central to the process.





Transition Year

Scoil Ruáin provides a vibrant, enjoyable and beneficial Transition Year Programme. Transition Year allows our students to mature, gain confidence and develop a wide range of skills, particularly in social awareness, whilst continuing to engage with school and academic life. Transition Year students in Scoil Ruáin engage with many activities and programmes, such as the annual Delphi trip, building their own School Bank, the school musical, participating in the Gaisce President's Awards, running their own tuck shop, and gaining valuable life skills through work experience.

Student Services

Pastoral Care

Scoil Ruáin endeavours to nurture positive relationships amongst the school community through its pastoral care structure, and to create an atmosphere in which students feel secure, know that they are valued and are encouraged in their learning, growth and social and spiritual development. Each year group is assigned a Year Head and Class Teachers who monitor the overall progress and welfare of the students. The teachers of Religion and SPHE, in particular, nurture the spiritual, personal and social development of each student and the Career Guidance Counsellor is always available to assist students who may need personal support. The Pastoral Care Team meets regularly to identify students having difficulty in coping with school life, to review the ongoing needs of students, and to plan future work.

Learning Support

Scoil Ruáin has a long tradition of supporting and including students with additional educational needs. Qualified and experienced learning support teachers work hard to ensure every student can access the curriculum.

Scoil Ruáin Student Mentors & Foróige's Big Brother Big Sister Mentoring Programme

Each incoming First Year student is paired with a trained Fifth Year student mentor. They meet throughout the year to ensure that the First Years are settling into their new school. The Mentor system allows new First Years to positively engage with an older student who is supportive and encouraging. As part of the Big Brother Big Sister Programme, First Year students are also paired with a Transition Year student with similar interests and hobbies.

Scoil Ruáin Student Council



The Student Council meets weekly with the aim of improving the quality of life for students in Scoil Ruáin. The Student Council takes an active role in fundraising, organising events and representing the opinions of the student body. Subject planning is of very good quality across all subject areas, and it was positive to see the focus on literacy and numeracy in the subject plans. There was also evidence that teachers are following the new junior cycle subject specifications in English, Science and Business.

Breakfast Club and Evening Study

Breakfast is provided free of charge to all students each morning. Evening Study is available to all first, second, third, fifth and sixth year students. First Year students avail of assisted study, with teachers on hand to encourage good practice and to help students with any difficulties. A snack is provided before study begins.



Scoil Ruáin Parents Association

The Scoil Ruáin Parents Association is an energetic organisation which does its utmost to promote and assist students, staff and management of the school. The Parents Association meets several times a year to discuss the various academic and extra-curricular activities and events that go on in school life. These meetings are attended by the Principal and Deputy Principal. The Parents Association is actively involved in fundraising for the school as well as assisting school management with various events which occur throughout the year, for example our Open Evening and 5K Run. New members are always welcome to attend meetings and get involved in this organisation, which makes Scoil Ruáin a better place for its students.

First Year Celebration Night

Each year, an evening of celebration in Scoil Ruáin marks the beginning of a new chapter in the lives of our first year students who have fitted in with ease into the school community. The school motto, 'Ad Totam Personam' frames the evening and refers to the education of the mind, the body and the spirit.

Facilities

Sports Pitches

Students have access to a full size GAA pitch as well as a large All-Weather Astro-turf pitch, which is in full use by our students up to 6pm each day and every lunch break.

Science Facilities

Scoil Ruáin has two modern Science Laboratories, and one large Science Demonstration room. All of these rooms are well stocked with the most up-to-date equipment.

Library

Our warm, welcoming and well-stocked library is a haven for our students to come and lose themselves in our large collections of books, magazines, journals and newspapers. Our librarian is on hand to assist students in choosing suitable reading material and to co-ordinate activities, such as World Book Day celebrations and Creative Writing competitions. The extensive reference section and computers with internet access provide invaluable support for students in their study, research and project work.







Facilities

IT Facilities

At Scoil Ruáin we aim to provide high standard information and technology services and support to students. Students have state of the art computing facilities, which enable the provision of a specific IT syllabus to Junior Cycle students in particular. Scoil Ruáin has access to 100MB Hi-Speed broadband connectivity and all classrooms are equipped with data projectors and PCs to facilitate the use of ICT in teaching and learning. The iPad initiative is further enhanced by the provision of Apple TV in many classrooms.

Specialist Rooms

Scoil Ruáin is equipped with up-to-date specialist rooms for the teaching of Materials Technology Wood, Materials Technology Metal, Art, Music, Home Economics, Technical Graphics, Design and Communications Graphics and Computer Studies.

Sports Hall and Gym

Scoil Ruáin has a modern, state of the art, indoor sports facility. Here, students have access to a fully equipped gym and full size basketball court where badminton, volleyball and table tenins can also be played. This facility allows students to continue to achieve their full potential in the challenging and competitive sporting world of today. It is used on a daily basis by all of our sports teams and physical education classes. The sports on offer here include basketball, indoor soccer, indoor hurling, badminton, volleyball and table tennis.

Co-curricular Activities

Gaeilge sa Scoil

The role of Irish is central to life in Scoil Ruáin, and is particularly celebrated by students and teachers during Seachtain na Gaeilge. Each year, two second year Scoil Ruáin students are awarded Scholarships which allow them to spend three weeks in the Gaeltacht.

Drop Everything and Read

Drop Everything and Read is an annual whole school initiative, which encourages students to read for leisure.

Book Club

The Scoil Ruáin Book Club meets fortnightly in the school library to discuss and deliberate on their chosen reads, or to debate authors, film adaptations and modern plot-lines. The school library's wellstocked collection ensures the success of the club.

Spelling Bee

The English Department in Scoil Ruáin runs a Spelling Bee League for first students each year. This is a very popular activity among students and is beneficial in improving literacy skills.

Extracurricular Activities

TY Musical

At the beginning of each year our TY students and their teachers work tirelessly towards staging a thrilling and entertaining musical, which they then perform for a wider audience of fellow students, teachers, family and members of the wider community in November.

Photography Club

The Photography Club is a well-established extracurricular activity in Scoil Ruáin which encourages budding photographers to improve their skills and confidence in photography. Members attend lectures on photography and then get the opportunity to put this theory into practice on a field trip. In 2014 the photography club visited Fota Wildlife Resort.

Speech and Drama

Classes are provided for students every week with the emphasis on performance, role-play and confidence building techniques. Students are prepared for the Irish Board of Speech and Drama grade exams, performance exams and public speaking exams as well as participation in local Drama Festivals.

Gardening Club

Scoil Ruáin's Gardening Club work tirelessly each week maintaining school flower beds, plants and gardens. We also have our own vegetable allotments.

Games Club

Scoil Ruáin Games Club takes place two lunchtimes a week. Students have the opportunity to play board games, chess, and pool or computer games.





Green Schools

Green-Schools is an international environmental education programme, environmental management system and award scheme that promotes whole school action towards a sustainable environment.

It is known internationally as Eco-Schools. Thanks to the hard work of teachers and the Green Schools Student Committee, Scoil Ruáin has been awarded four Green Flags to date and is currently working on the fifth flag for Biodiversity.



ASD Education Facility

In co-operation with the Department of Education and Skills, Scoil Ruain has recently opened 'Coiscéim,' an education facility for students with Autistic Spectrum Disorders (ASD).

A holistic approach is taken when planning for the education of the students with ASD. Following the information gathering and consultation process, an educational plan is developed that caters for the student's social, sensory and educational needs.









Students linked to Coiscéim attend mainstream classes and timetabled classes within the facility. Coiscéim is also available to students should they need to withdraw for an unscheduled class period. Classes within the Coiscéim are provided on an individual and small group basis. They are taught by a resource teacher and supported by special needs assistants.

Scoil Ruain is currently in consultation with the Department of Education and Skills to finalise the designs of purpose built classrooms for Coiscéim.

School Tours

Students derive a great deal of educational benefit from participating in well planned school tours and field trips. In 2016, the 2nd Year School Tour returned to Barcelona. Both students and teaches thoroughly enjoyed themselves.




