**U17 Munster Hurling Final Champions** 

On a wet and windy day on the 4G in Fethard Town Park, Scoil Ruain secured a momentous victory against a strong Mount Sion CBS side. Playing against a galeforce breeze in the first half, scoring chances were hard to come by for the Killenaule team. Mount Soin built up an early lead and left by 8 points to 2 early on. However, Scoil Ruain were clinical in their attacking play. Andy Williams made a lung-bursting run and found the back of the net. Full forward Micael Kelly caused havoc on the square's edge and showed great strength and skill in scoring Scoil Ruain's second goal. Though Mount Sion could score points from long range, Scoil Ruain scored a crucial third goal when a Danny Shelly delivery was flicked to the back of the net by Owen O Dwyer. The Waterford side did manage to get a goal of their own. However, Scoil Ruain showed resilience in the final half minutes, with Charlie Barrett saving a 21-yard free. At half-time, Mount Sion led 1-11 to 3-02. Scoil Ruain dominated the second half with the wind on their backs but struggled to capitalise on their opportunities. Initially, their attackers struggled to navigate the stormy conditions and hit several wides. The breakthrough came midway through the second half, with a Danny Shelly goal, which put Scoil Ruain in the lead. With Mount Sion now forced to attack, scoring opportunities became more frequent for Scoil Ruain. Points from captain Charlie Barrett and Cillian Direen put Scoil Ruain in control before the industrious Igor Miguel sealed the victory with an inspirational point from near the sideline.

Danny Cashin was rock solid in the goals while scoring opportunities for Mount Sion were kept to a minimum by a solid full-back line of Owen Fanning, Fred Perry and Pierce Vaughan. Shane Ryan commanded at centre-back while Darragh O Gorman worked tirelessly in the middle of the field. Darragh Heffernan and Rory Shelly battled hard throughout, while Cathal Lawrence never stopped running following his introduction. There were jubilant scenes at the final whistle, and Charlie Barrett accepted the cup on behalf of the Scoil Ruain team.



#### **Geography Update**

The Leaving Certificate Geography class carried out their Geographical Investigation on the 24th of October in Liscannor Bay, Co. Clare. The journey kicked off at 7am for the sixteen students accompanied by Ms. Boland and Ms. Kennedy. They were welcomed in Lahinch by blue skies and dry conditions which made it much easier to carry out all tasks and it also meant the rain gear was left on the bus! They based themselves at three different locations, Creg Beach, Lahinch promenade and Liscannor where they carried out the activities for completing their report. They measured cliff height, carried out beach material analysis, observed wave characteristics and compared historical maps to the current coastline's state, tying it altogether to tell the story of the dominant processes on the coastline. It was a very successful trip, and everyone enjoyed their day out, especially since there was an obligatory stop at Supermacs on route home. Now for the fun part, writing the report worth 20%!!



One of the first tasks our first years were asked to do this year in their Geography classes was to create a model of the Structure of the Earth using a styrofoam ball. The creativity that the students demonstrated was impressive and they enjoyed producing these so much that they requested designing more 3D models throughout the year.
